### WINTER SNOW REMOVAL REGULATIONS

It's that time again and we would like to remind residents of winter snow removal regulations.

The Town has a snow removal schedule that is based on a road priority system. In general snow removal operations will commence after snowfall accumulations of up to 50 mm (2 inches). Salting and plowing begins on the main arterial roads, followed by collector roads, steep hills, school routes and then moves onto residential streets and lanes as necessary.



#### PARKING REGULATIONS DURING WINTER MONTHS

The Town of Princeton Highways, Traffic and Parking Bylaw states "In order to facilitate snow removal from streets during the period from November 1 to March 31 the following regulations are in effect:

Parking is not permitted on Bridge Street and Vermillion Avenue between the hours of 11pm and 8am."

In addition, residents are asked to please assist our crew when they are plowing by not parking on streets during snow removal.

#### **CLEARING OF SIDEWALKS**



The Town of Princeton is responsible for snow and ice removal from public sidewalks bordering Town owned facilities only. It is the responsibility of the property owner or occupier to remove snow and ice from sidewalks adjacent to their property. As noted in the Town of Princeton Highways, Traffic and Parking Bylaw "No person shall, without prior written approval of the town leave snow, ice or rubbish on the sidewalks or any portion of them bordering real property and; it shall be the duty of the owner or occupier of any real property to remove all such snow, ice and rubbish from the sidewalk before the hour of 11am each day unless requested to do so earlier by the Town."

Failure to do so can result in a fine of up to \$100.

When residents or businesses shovel snow from their driveway or sidewalk onto the road it can freeze and can pose a hazard to both motorists and snow removal equipment. When shoveling your driveway or sidewalk, we are requesting that you not place the snow on the municipal road. Please pile the snow on the left side of your driveway (looking at your property). This will improve visibility of approaching traffic and will reduce the potential for the snow to be pushed back into your driveway by the plows.

Thank you for your cooperation in following these simple steps to ensure a safe winter season and remember, if you are out on the roads during a snowstorm, drive with caution and according to road conditions. Stay a safe distance from snow removal equipment. They need room to do the job safely!
